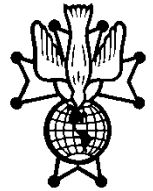

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, (Please read this slowly and carefully: I just got back from vacation!!!!)

By the time we get this we'll be already into Lent this year; but I'd like to propose a Lenten practice that would still be able to help a lot of us live this very precious time in the liturgical year. We have Lent to help us prepare for the most important celebration of our faith; the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus our Lord and Savior!

I'm proposing that we can get a bunch out of this holy season if we can take a moment to select a *particular* focus for our growing in faith and love and closeness to Jesus. So pick a special virtue you'd like to get better at, for example daily prayer (morning, noon, bedtime), whatever, then look for a "*new*" *thought as often as you can, and see how the Holy Spirit will broaden your concept of that virtue to really influence others by good example.*

Or, we can choose a particular temptation that picks on us too much, eg. anger, self-centeredness, sexual preoccupation, overeating, overuse of alcohol, gossip, sloth (there's a bunch, eh?) that gets us being distractions from rather than attractions to the Lord.

Whatever our choice, we can celebrate Easter and its whole holy season in deeper love, not only with the Lord our God but even with one another and also new friends this will bring us.

One final little thought: for years I've had the practice of choosing a virtue I can keep growing in AND choosing to give up something I just **love** to get back!!! Go for it and FLOURISH!!!

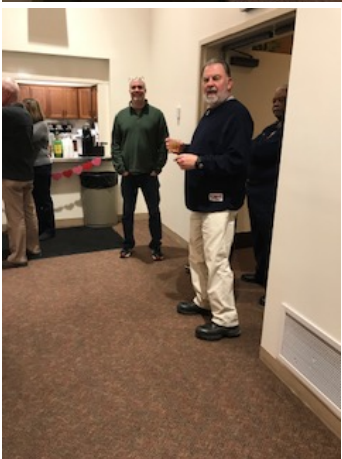

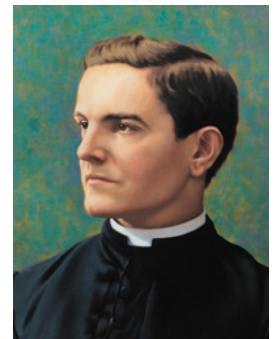

The Knights of Columbus began in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, in 1882, when Father Michael J. McGivney called together a small group of pioneering Catholic laymen and founded a society designed to provide financial assistance for widows and orphans of members. March 29 marks the 131st anniversary of the Order receiving its charter from the State of Connecticut. The anniversary of the realization of Father McGivney's dream is a cause for celebration.



Prayer for the Canonization of Father Michael J. McGivney Founder of the Knights of Columbus

*God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue to his work of caring for the needy and outcast.
