- 3. Leave no Knight or neighbor behind. Check on your more elderly Knights and neighbors. A phone call to see if the individual is okay or ask to see if they need food or medication certainly can aid those less mobile from isolation. Just leave the food on their doorstep after advising when you'll be able to drop the items off.
- 4. Give blood. I have been a blood donor for many years and normally donate up to 2 pints each time. Of course, you don't have to donate that much, but do think about giving blood as there is a true need for blood donors right now.

We still look forward to having a Fourth Degree Exemplification. At this time, it has been rescheduled from April to the weekend of June 5, 6 & 7 at the Radisson, Toledo, OH. For those of you who had made hotel reservations already, those reservations have been transferred to the June dates. You can cancel directly with the hotel at 419-381-6800 if these new dates conflict with vacations or other plans. In addition, if you had already paid for the banquet or the Ladies Luncheon fees, but cannot attend, you can request a refund.

For our Candidates, if they are not able to attend in June, a refund will be made for any costs they already paid. However, if the Candidate was under date restrictions and only available for the Friday night Exemplification, they can still keep that night, or they are able to participate on Saturday and include their spouse/family/friend. If the Candidate chooses Saturday, they will be obligated to cover the banquet and Ladies Luncheon charges they and their guest attends.

I will keep you posted on our potential Candidates and other related news as we draw closer to the newly scheduled 4th Degree Exemplification weekend.

Easter is still on schedule and it's a reminder to us all that "He is Risen." We, Knights and patriots, will as well as we recommit ourselves to "One Nation under God, indivisible."




