

On the road to Sainthood . . . The **Knights of Columbus' Founder, Father Michael McGivney**, created this Order in 1882 to help families in need due to the high death rate of men, the typical breadwinner at that time, due to the type of jobs available to Irish Catholics. The 4th Degree, which is the highest level of Knight, was added for the primary purpose to "foster the spirit of **Patriotism** in members and communities at large, and encourage active Catholic citizenship." On March 5, 2008, the Knights helped to open the door to sainthood for Fr. McGivney, at which time Pope Benedict XVI declared Fr. McGivney Venerable, which is the first step. Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to Fr.

McGivney on May 26, 2020. I hope many of you were able to watch the beatification Mass held on October 31, 2020, which was streamed through the Knights of Columbus website as well as carried on EWTN.

"TAPS" played at Military
Funerals -- I didn't know there
were words written for this special
melody. Did you?

If any of you have ever been to a military funeral in which taps was played; this brings out a new meaning of it.

Here is something Every American should know.

We in the United States have all heard the haunting song, 'Taps...' It's the song that gives us the lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes.

But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Elli was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land.

During the night, Captain Elli heard the moans of a soldier who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment.

When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead.


